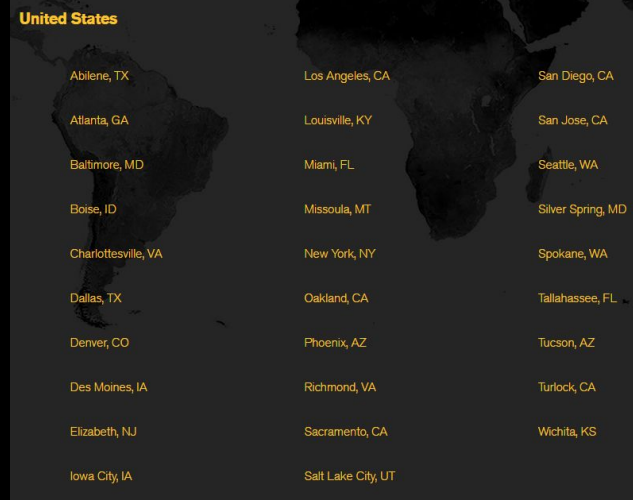
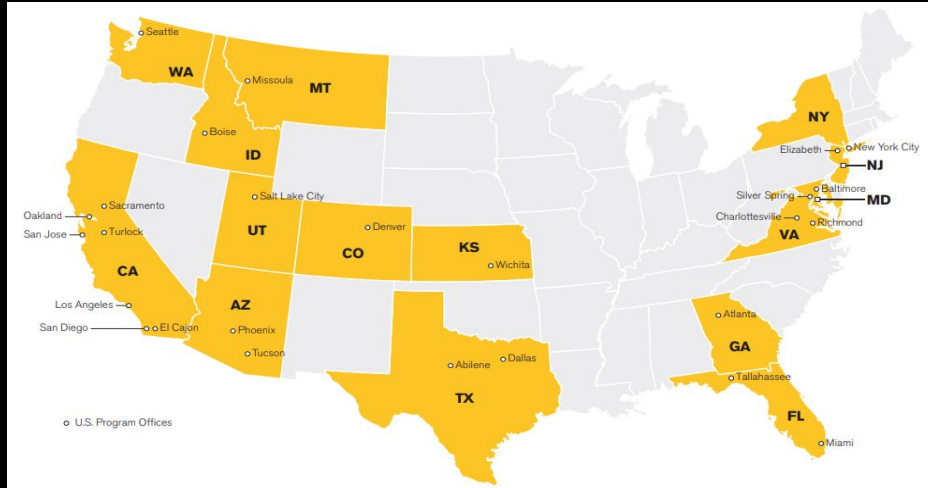
## MISSION

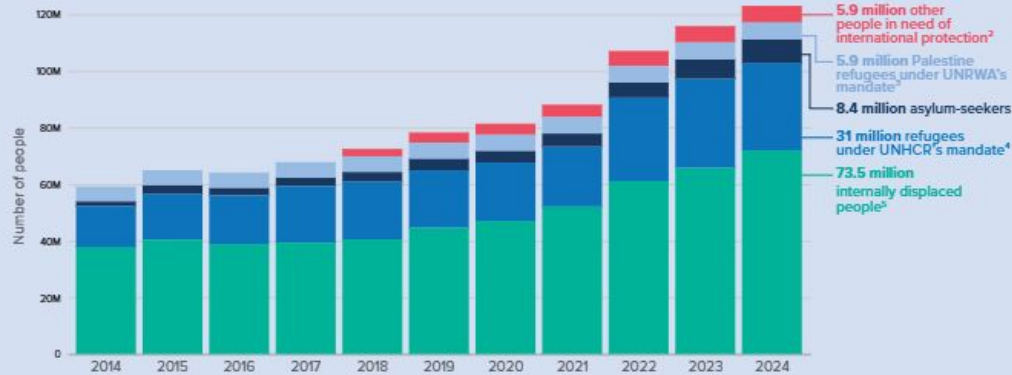

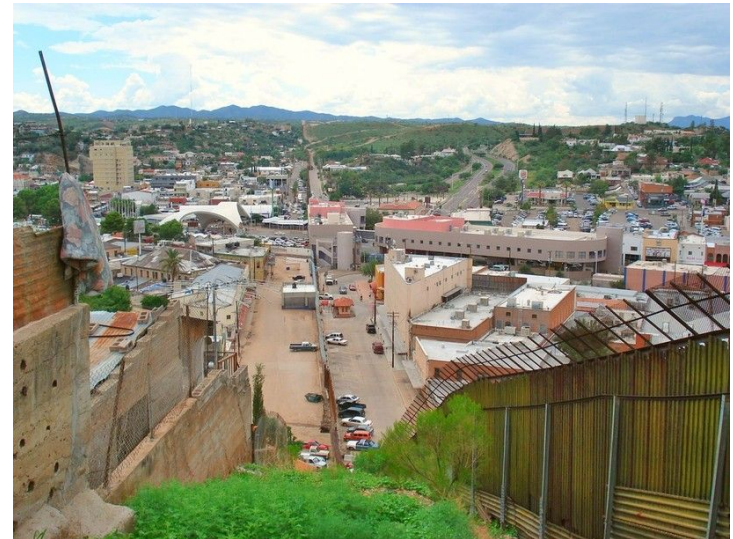

## 6-week Summer Internship Program *"Borderlands Ambassadors"*

- Immersive program that takes students on field trips across the Arizona/Sonora borderlands to learn about politics, economics, law, humanitarian aid, the environment, culture, and much more
- Bi-national program that involves continually crossing the border and living in a bi-national community
- People-focused and place-focused program that involves 2 days/week of service learning internship at a non-profit in Mexico and 3-5 days/week of field trips across the region to learn from community leaders and residents

- Helps students imagine their life after graduation and provides the relationships and connections to move forward
